writers of all genres in creating each scene they put down on paper, reminding us that when a screenwriter is limited to 120 words on paper, every word must count.

She provided relevant handouts addressing several tricks of the trade, including writing about what your character yearns for, what the set/up and pay/off is each step of the way, and my favorite, how to write 100 words for 100 days; do that and you'll be ahead 10,000 words.

- 2. I have worked in and/or visited approximately 30 countries. My longest commute was twice monthly from SFO to Lisbon, Portugal.




- 3. I did four start-ups as a V.P. or Exec. My score was two wins, one draw, and one loss.

It was that summer, at age seventeen, that Sally J Gaffney gave to Roswell Chamblee the love she thought she would save for marriage. She had brought a blanket so together they could lie out under the stars and count the constellations. The gnats and no-see-'ems were impossible, though, so they fled to the screened deck behind the old Chamblee mansion, near the tobacco fields. It was late. Roswell's mom and dad had long gone to sleep.

A guick thunderstorm had doused the countryside minutes after they found themselves on the blanket covering the wooden deck, listening to the rain pelt the tar paper roof above them. They laughed about how lucky they were. The rain dissipated, the clouds rolled away, and bright moonbeams shined down on the fields outside Cheraw, gently illuminating her soft pale skin. A chorus of frogs, grateful for the rain, covered the fields and trees with so much racket that Sally J and Roswell didn't need to worry about being heard. This interactive writing feature will stretch your imagination and challenge


